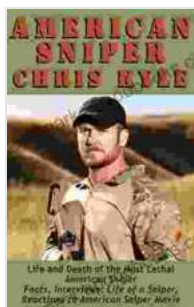


The Life and Death of the Most Lethal American Sniper

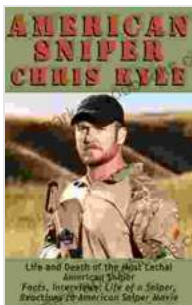
The Book
