




Shape is a two-dimensional area defined by an outline. Students can create shapes through drawing, cutting, or molding, exploring different forms and compositions to create pleasing aesthetic effects.



Color is a powerful element that evokes emotions, creates atmosphere, and conveys messages. Elementary students can experiment with colors, exploring tints, shades, and hues to produce vibrant and meaningful artwork.




Texture refers to the surface quality of an object or image. Students can explore different textures through tactile experiences and art materials, creating visual interest and adding depth to their artwork.



Space is the area within or around an artwork. Students can experiment with positive and negative space to create visual balance and depth, directing the viewer's eye through the composition.

The Principles of Design



Balance is the distribution of visual elements within an artwork. Students can explore symmetrical, asymmetrical, and radial balance to create visually appealing and harmonious compositions.



Balance

A distribution of visual weight on either side of the vertical axis. Symmetrical balance uses the same characteristics. Asymmetrical uses different but equally weighted features.



Contrast

The arrangement of opposite elements (light vs. dark, rough vs. smooth, small vs large, etc...) in a composition so as to create visual interest.



Emphasis

Used to make certain parts of an Artwork stand out. It creates the center of interest or focal point. It is the place in which an Artist draws your eye to first.



Movement

How the eye moves through the composition; leading the attention of the viewer from one aspect of the work to another. Can create the illusion of action.



Pattern

The repetition of specific visual elements such as a unit of shape or form. A method used to organize surfaces in a consistent regular manner.



Rhythm


Regular repetition of, or alternation in elements to create cohesiveness and interest.




Unity

Visually pleasing agreement among the elements in a design; It is the feeling that everything in the work of Art works together and looks like it fits.


Emphasis is the creation of a focal point or point of interest in an artwork. Students can achieve emphasis through contrast, color, size, or placement, drawing the viewer's attention to specific elements.



Harmony is the creation of a unified and cohesive artwork. Students can explore harmony through repetition, contrast, and proximity, creating a sense of visual unity and pleasing aesthetic effects.



Variety is the inclusion of different elements and principles to create visual interest and prevent monotony. Students can incorporate variety through color, shape, texture, and composition, keeping their artwork stimulating and engaging.



Unity is the creation of a cohesive and unified artwork. Students can achieve unity through repetition, color harmony, and consistent style, creating a sense of wholeness and completeness.

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
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
